

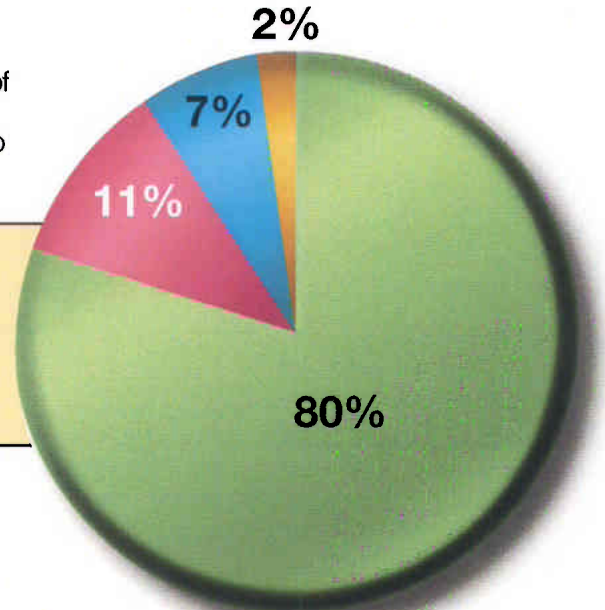

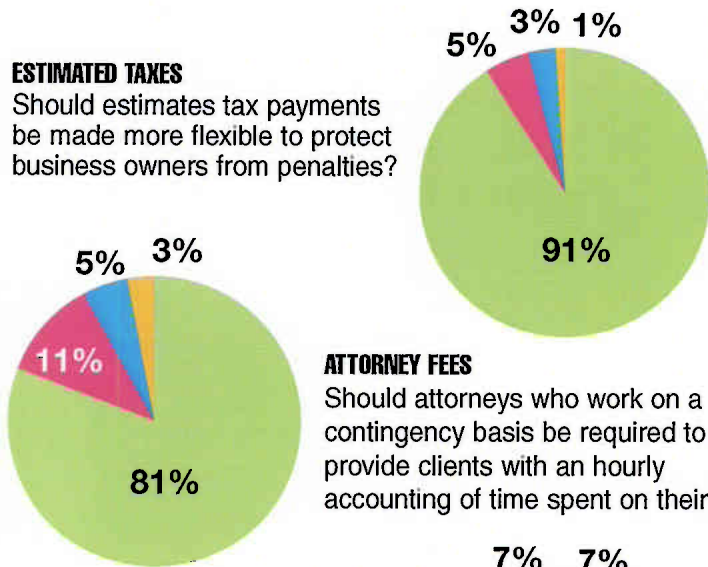
MOTOR VEHICLES

Should automobile manufacturers be required to disclose to car buyers and repair shops information needed to repair or maintain their vehicles?



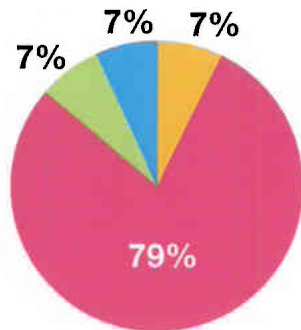
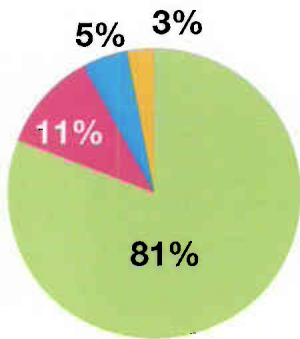
ESTIMATED TAXES

Should estimates tax payments be made more flexible to protect business owners from penalties?



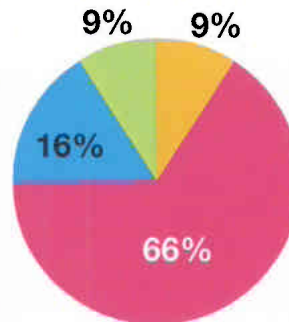
ATTORNEY FEES

Should attorneys who work on a contingency basis be required to provide clients with an hourly accounting of time spent on their case?



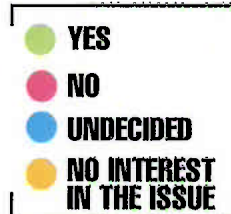
HEARING TESTS
